

The Role of the PPC

Is ministerial not merely functional

To promote the Church's mission

To live and communicate the love, values and teachings of Christ in the world

Shares the responsibility for the ongoing development of faith in the parish

To provide support parishioners in their efforts to live as followers of Christ

What is Pastoral Action

Pastoral Action is ...

inspired by the Gospel – centred on its proclamation

Action that is intended to ...

- build warm human community
- nourish the faith of its members
- enable members to celebrate their lives in liturgical worship
- enable members to give witness to their faith in daily life.

- studying parish issues
- proposing practical conclusions to the pastor
- assessing and promoting the pastoral activity of the parish
- collaborating with all ministries within the parish, neighbouring parishes and Church agencies to carry out the mission of the Church
- developing long range strategies for the future of the parish


Prayer - an integral part of Parish Pastoral Meetings

Effective meetings begin and end with prayer and, when necessary, turn to prayer during the meeting. This could be the case where matters of very serious consequence for the parish are to be considered and decided and helpful where contentious matters have introduced some tension.

- Scripture read aloud.
- A silence.
- Passage read aloud again.
- Silence: ten minutes.
- Each member shares, beginning with:
- In relation to the question/issue, through the Word of today, I heard the Spirit speaking to me... Each member shares again, beginning with the words:
- In the Voices of the group, I heard the Spirit saying.....
